1 Methodology



Methodology







2 x online, 90-min qualitative focus groups

- 7 participants in each group
- Groups were split by age. Each had a mix of Socio Economic Group and gender
- Participants came from different locations across England
- Conducted 24th November 2022


15-minute online survey

- Survey conducted with 1,005 people, in twotier areas across England
- Data weighted to be representative of the population in England
- Sample gives a margin for error of 3% at a 95% confidence level
- Survey in field 8th to 20th December 2022



^{*} Respondent postcodes were collected and coded into postcode data from ONS to determine which district and county council area they were located in. Questions were then tailored to each respondent so that they answered questions about their local council/s


2 Awareness

Confidence naming their councils



"It's fairly easy, I've grown up in the area and you see it written on leaflets and in the town."




Respondents were asked to write in their local council(s) that provide services for them. Responses were then coded against the correct answer, which was based on their postcode






Correct identification of county run services is slightly lower, with highways being the most strongly associated service



















Showing % of two-tier residents selecting each






Satisfaction with districts is higher than that of counties in all age groups, socio-economic groups and by gender



Showing % net: dissatisfied (very or somewhat) with their councils





Most residents feel that district council services have a positive impact on the local area



"The services [local district council] provides have a positive impact on me and my local area."



"If [local district council] stopped running things in my local area there would be a significant negative impact on the local community and economy."

"I'd say district council services are really vital – without most of these [services] you'd be really struggling." "It's definitely important, definitely. It all contributes to a thriving community, and if it's done well it will just improve it."


"If we didn't have these services, the local area would depreciate rapidly."




5 Trust








Residents agree their district council contributes positively to the local area, understand its needs and has its interests at heart






While they also agree county council services have a positive impact, levels of agreement are lower when compared to districts


Agreement with statements on County Councils

The majority feel that their district council understands and values the interests of their communities






Districts are trusted more than counties or national government to tackle local issues and care for local people




Larger-scale issues are seen to be shared with counties or more the responsibility of national government
